Self Help Group Formation and Strengthening

Self Help Group(SHG) works as a platform for bringing women together. Our strategy is to engage with women groups by either strengthening the existing SHGs or by creating a new group, where it is needed.

Women are trained on financial literacy, book keeping, documentation, gender sensitisation and advocacy. The main objective of this initiative is to inculcate the habit of savings amongst the women.

Income Generation & Livelihood Trainings

We invest in building capacities of women by providing skill development training to create livelihood sources. The trained beneficiaries are further linked with the market and service sector for employment. Women are trained on various IGA such as Khakhra making, Mushroom production, Jack Fruit processing, Akhand Lamp making, Best out-of-waste from Coconut, Kite making, Tailoring, Nursing, Rubber making etc.

As a result of this initiative, trained women have started their own business where they are not only supporting their own families but also providing employment opportunities to other women of their villages.











Sustainable Agriculture

We also work with women who represent the farmer community to improve their current farming practices. We support them in the community through capacity building activities like livestock care management and agriculture practices. This not only strengthens the knowledge about modern techniques of farming, increased crop yield skills and agricultural practices expertise of the farmers, but also establishes linkages with the market to ensure direct financial benefits.

In Limda, Gujarat we are working on biogas utilisation as a mainstream cooking fuel. We have installed household level biogas units for the same. Women have already started realising the benefits as this has freed them from long walks to fetch wood. The additional time is now invested in income generation or with the family.

Livestock Care & Management

Livestock is the alternative source of income for the farming community. To promote better livestock care and management practices various activities have been initiated. These range from providing artificial insemination (AI) services at the doorstep of the farmer to organising infertility and vaccination camps.
